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

If empirical evidence on the logics of engagement and resilience factors of young people (women and men) to violent extremism is produced and disseminated, **and** decision-makers use these as the basis for policymaking to prevent and combat violent extremism, **then** they will more effectively prevent and counter the involvement of young people (women and men) in violent extremist groups in Mali and Niger.
