## Caribbean ICT Roundtable - Unprecedented Turn Out

The second in a series of regional events on the use of ICTs for development was held October 28-30, in Barbados. Chaired by the ICA and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), the Caribbean ICT Roundtable is being hailed a huge success. More than a hundred high profile participants, representing the region from various sectors, attended the working event that focused on the creation of a regional strategy for ICT development. On the final day of meetings, the ICA brought leading financial institutions together with development partners to discuss joint funding initiatives. Among others, the World Bank, Inter-American Development Bank, Caribbean Development Bank, UNESCO, and USAID, were in attendance.

## **Dgroups Help Make Connections & Receive Funding**

Facilitating knowledge exchange continues to be a key objective of the ICA. Several participants volunteered to chair the new Dgroups, facilitating the discussions around the specific themes.

Prior to the Caribbean ICT Roundtable, an online discussion group was launched to give participants a chance to introduce themselves and discuss their expectations and ideas for the roundtable. The Dgroup is still in use after the event, as a means to disseminate general related information and continue the dialogue on regional ICT projects and programs.

A Dgroup for the Southern Cone also exists to support that region's exchange of ideas. Positive feedback from participants and funding offers from donors will ensure the continued use of these important communication tools.

## **Sharing 'Connecting Canadians' Experience**

The HAB meetings were prefaced by a "Connectivity Tour: Closing the Digital Divide", coordinated by Industry Canada's Office of International Partnerships. Participants visited Industry Canada's leading innovative connectivity initiatives, including; a SchoolNet-connected school, the Telesat facilities for a demonstration of teleconferencing to remote/rural communities, the Computers for Schools Facility, a Smart Communities Program (OCRI/City of Ottawa), and learned about the Government-on-line Initiative.

Feedback from participants was very positive, with the key lesson learned being that the people (especially youth), and not the technology, are the key enablers of change.
