Prime Minister of Canada Witnesses signing of E-Campus Americas Project: ICA Commits CDN\$300.000

In Mexico, on February 27, 2003, Prime Minister of Canada Jean Chrétien and Mexican President Vicente Fox witnessed the signing of a letter of intent between the Canadian Centre for Management Development (CCMD) and the Mexican Ministry of Comptrollership and Administrative Development (SECODAM). The goal of this e-Learning initiative, called "E-Campus Americas" is to modernize and connect the public service through an exchange of best practices. ICA has committed \$300,000 to the project, and is pleased to be able to broker Canadian experience to the South and adapt it for local needs. For more information see:

"Virtual Parliament" Online Chat Launched to Promote Inter-Parliamentary Dialogue

February 20/21, over 87 parliamentarians from 19 countries met in Panama City to discuss issues on the hemispheric agenda. The Institute for Connectivity in the (ICA) is a major Americas supporter of Interparlamentario de las Américas' (FIPA) connectivity efforts, having partnered with Bellanet and the Centre to FIPA's "Virtual Parliamentary create Parliament". This project focuses on meeting the information and communication needs of the Foro Interparlamentario de las Américas (FIPA). Regional Satellite Study Underway to Negotiate a Bulk Deal with Satellite Providers

ICA has undertaken a market analysis of available Satellite Service Providers to be completed by April 2003. The goal is to identify satellite connectivity options for Latin America and the Caribbean, and make recommendations towards negotiating a comprehensive agreement with Satellite Providers. A regional satellite agreement would help achieve economies of scale, resulting in lower prices, and improved opportunities for regional telecenters and other small rural institutions.

Focus on Caribbean: ICA Announces Funding for Three ICT for Development Projects

- Caribbean Distance Education Network (CDEN): ICA sends a consultant from the College of the North Atlantic, Newfoundland, to participate in a needs assessment study for a Caribbean Distance Education Network (CDEN). The project is being developed in collaboration with the World Bank and the OAS.
- Strategic Regional Online Collaboration: To follow-up on the recommendations of the ICA/ITU Caribbean ICT Roundtable, ICA has partnered with Bellanet to launch six thematic virtual discussion groups. Over 100 people are signed up and actively exchanging ideas. The goal is to identify potential regional projects, and provide collective input to upcoming international events.
- Development of an ICT Incubator in the Caribbean CBET: Stemming from recent consultations, in conjunction with the Caribbean Development Bank, ICA will provide funding for the development of an ICT small enterprise incubation and micro enterprise facility for the Caribbean region.
