### BUDGETARY AND FINANCIAL MATTERS

### BALANCE SHEET AS AT 30 NOVEMBER 1986 AND COMPARISON OF EXPENDITURE INCURRED AS AGAINST BUDGET

- 1. To assist the Commission in its ongoing review of the financial performance of the Commission, the following documents are attached:
  - A Balance Sheet as at 30 November, 1986 (ANNEX 1);
  - A summary schedule of expenditures and income for the first eleven months of 1986 and cumulatively for the period from inception of the Commission to the end of November, 1986 as compared to the Revised Budget adopted by the Commission at its meeting in Sao Paulo (ANNEX 2).
- 2. You will note from ANNEX 2 that in spite of the exchange losses we continue to incur, expenditure during the first eleven months of this year has been significantly under that budgeted for the same period. Cumulative expenditure from inception until the end of November 1986 has also been under Budget. More importantly, our income for the first eleven months of this year and cumulatively from inception were both significantly in excess of that foreseen in the Sao Paulo Budget and for this reason, we have been able to avoid the deficit foreseen in the Sao Paulo Budget.

### CASHFLOW PROJECTION FOR THE PERIOD 1 DECEMBER, 1986 TO 31 DECEMBER, 1987

3. To illustrate the timing and extent of the Commission's funding needs during the remainder of its operations, we have prepared and attached as ANNEX 3 a cashflow projection which sets out (i) the details of all expenditures incurred to date, (ii) a detailed month-by-month forecast of the expenditures which will need to be made during the period 1 December, 1986 until 31 December, 1987 if the Commission is to complete its mandate as approved at the Inaugural Meeting, (iii) the income we have received from inception to the end of

November, 1986 and (iv) the income we can be reasonably certain to receive between the 1st of December, 1986 and the end of 1987.

- 4. In comparing the attached cashflow forecast to the Cashflow Forecast presented to the Commission in Harare in September, you will note that:
  - Staff cost have remained virtually the same and continue to reflect the reductions anticipated over the next 13 months;
  - Since the Harare meeting, we have received \$612,000 of additional income (\$450,000 from Japan, \$147,000 from Canada and \$15,000 from Cameroun) and additional pledges for 1987 of \$405,000: \$150,000 from the German Foundation for International Development, \$125,000 from NORAD, \$70,000 from Norway and \$60,000 from Portugal, resulting in an increase in our projected income of \$1.17 million;
  - Our projected expenditures for the remainder of the Commission's operations have increased by \$611,000, principally due to the inclusion of the cost of the special meeting in January (\$150,000), an increase in the cost associated with the Japanese meeting (\$135,000) and the inclusion in the budget of the cost associated with the public information programme (\$250,000) and a portion of the cost of translating the final report into the official U.N. language (\$60,000);
  - As a result, our projected total shortfall through to the end of 1987 has been reduced from \$1.4 million to \$990,000.

#### FUNDRAISING EFFORTS AND RESULTS

- 5. Fundraising efforts have continued since the Harare meeting; and as a result of the efforts of the Chairman, Commissioner Okita and others, we have been successful, as mentioned above, in locating an additional \$1.17 million of funds for the Commission's work.
- 6. Attached as ANNEX 4 is a schedule listing all contributions pledged and received, those pledged but not yet received and those requested but not yet received, all as of the end of November, 1986. From that schedule you will note that we have now received contributions of \$5,729,310 and have pledges for an additional \$1,011,000 for a total of \$6,740,310.

- Notwithstanding the success of our recent fundraising 7. efforts, we are still short of the funds needed (\$990,000) to cover our anticipated expenditures for 1987. In that regard, decisions are expected shortly on the funding request of \$300,000 made to the Hewlitt Foundation, those of \$250,000 each made to the Carnegie and Alton Jones Foundations and on those made to the OPEC Fund and to Spain (\$50,000). We have also been advised that a grant of \$200,000 for the Commission has been requested in the EEC's budget for 1987 and we are optimistic that approval for that grant will be forthcoming. In addition, we are hopeful of obtaining additional grants for 1987 from the Ford and MacArthur Foundations, as well as from Denmark, the Federal Republic of Germany, Finland, Sweden and Saudi Arabia.
- 9. Thanks mainly to the Japanese government, we were able to secure sufficient funds to complete our work in 1986. Were we successful in obtaining all of the contributions we consider as reasonably possible in 1987 (a list of which is set out in ANNEX 3) we could obtain sufficient funds to complete our mandate. It is therefore important that our efforts continue to be concentrated on obtaining those possible contributions and a discussion on how this should be done will take place during the meeting in Moscow.
