2. Scoring System

The evaluator decided to use a scoring system in order to obtain a fair measure of the relative success of the award. The total possible points which could be obtained was 50.

The first consideration was whether or not the respondent had reached the stated objective (1). This consideration was assigned a possible total of 10 points.

Equal points, 5 each, were possible under the following headings:

- (2) Special rewards/difficulties to overcome
- (3) What motivated the respondent to join the program and to continue
- (4) Were there any career changes which may have been as a result of the award
- (5) What value has the respondent received from the award
- (6) Did the award enhance professional development
- (7) What changes in life style came as a result of the award
- (8) What suggestions are there for improving the award.

The total of this point system gave a good indication that some of the people seemed to have been more successful in meeting objectives than some others.

3. As each of the responses were evaluated, the most important observations were recorded. These are presented here to form the raw data base.

5. Observations of the Canadian Participants in the IDRC Fellowship Awards

- 1. Most people were highly appreciative of the award and greatly valued the opportunity it provided for them.

- 3. In some cases great changes occurred in the professional and academic careers of the respondents; however, apparently not much change took place in their lifestyle.
- 4. In most cases, the education, training, and experience provided the awardee with the opportunity to become better equipped to serve in international development and indeed, in some cases, complete changes were made in career and lifestyles in order to begin work in the international field.

6. Recommendations for the Future

- 1. It is suggested the follow-up be done for obtaining radio stories, TV films and print material. The following individuals should be considered: 164, 179, 181, 204, 206, 209, 215, 222, 226, (272 & 277), and there is a very special story under 230 for a Christian church magazine.
- 2. There were some slight criticisms, i.e., some of the respondents felt that they should have been better briefed and others thought that some specific jobs in international development should have been available to them at the end of the course.

10. Observations related to the Non-Canadian participants in the IDRC Fellowship Awards

- 1. Some candidates sent in truly outstanding reports, but others did not. The best reports were related to finding practical solutions to difficult national or regional problems.
- 2. Many of the awards appear to have perhaps produced self satisfied, arrogant and insular academic professionals.
- 3. In some cases, the recipient appears to want another research award to apparently enhance his academic stature and image. The awards may be seen as a means for personal and professional enphancement of careers.
- 4. Many of the respondents suggested that a mechanism could have been put in place to enable IDRC to be in touch with the awardees readily and permitted the awardees to be in touch with one another.
- 5. Some said that they were not properly de-briefed, and they say this as a weakness in the program.
- 6. Some of the respondents said they wanted IDRC to hire them when they finished their award, or at least, obtain jobs for them.
- 7. Some of the respondents suggested an alumni of graduates could have been, and still could be, formed.

11. Recommendations for the Future

- 1. Some of the award recipients were deeply committed and dynamic people; these were identified for follow-up, especially to do media work with them to promote IDRC and international development at home and abroad.
- 2. A better job could have been done by IDRC to keep in touch with awardees. If this had been done it would have been easier for IDRC to have conducted this evaluation.
- 3. It would be useful to establish a way to identify award applicants so that the self-serving kind did not become part of this award system.
- 4. Follow ups could be done with a few of the respondents. They might be done to reach various audiences in the various regions of the world. The following persons should be considered: 27, 76, 91, 102, 118, 132, 141 and 142.

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12. Overall Recommendations for both Canadian and Non-Canadian Participants in the IDRC Fellowship Awards

If the IDRC Awards were to be continued, the following suggestions are made to improve the overall program:

- 1. Improvements should be made in the communications between the IDRC and the awardees; this might include a newsletter, and could also include consideration for the beginning of an alumni of graduates. In any case, an up-to-date mailing list should have been maintained.
- 2. Develop press stories, radio and television shorts, as the program progressed. This could have provided an interesting and balanced flow of information from the program to the media.
- 3. Arrangements need to be made to publish the reports and papers generated by the awardees.
- 4. A great deal of good public relations and publicity for IDRC could result from interviews with some of the awardees.
- 5. A greater effort should be made to try to weed out the undesirehies for partition in the program. This perhaps might
 be done by a revision of the application form and the methods and
 approach used in the interviews.
- 6. Put the graduates from the course in the IDRC Job Bank, so that these people can be invited to fill vacant positions, as they become available.
- 7. An evaluation of the Awards Program should have been done five years after the program was started.

There is no question that the IDRC Awards Program was instrumental in improving the level and quality of professional service for individuals to serve in Third World countries. Almost every profession was represented in the program and services represented all of the phases — consulting, teaching, research, constructing and advising. To have contributed so generously in so many fields and for students around the world — the IDRC warrants thanks and praise.
