Project Activities

Regional Workshop to Validate Situation Analysis

The Regional Workshop to validate the Situation Analysis of Knowledge Translation and Use of Research Results in MNCH was held in Dakar from 18 to 20 February. The objective of the workshop was to "validate the findings of the situation analysis and identify interventions to be implemented" The workshop gathered together seventy-six participants including MNCH policy makers, researchers, consultants, MNCH learned societies, United Nations regional offices, IDRC, the Canadian government, WAHO and the entire project team . During the three-day workshop, participants listened to presentations and were involved in group work on:

The findings of the situation analysis based on 3 focus areas namely:

I) Knowledge Translation and the Use of Evidence in MNCH, ii) Factoring in Gender and Equity aspects in Mother and Child Health Programmes, iii) Health System Factors influencing Mother and Child Health.

Key messages, potential users and sharing approaches for research projects.



-The Monitoring and Evaluation framework of the Innovating for Maternal and Child Health in Africa (ISMEA). The presentation focused on the Logical Framework of the Initiative, and Assessment Indicators of WAHO and Research Teams:

-Next steps towards implementation of research projects and MEP project taking into account the outcomes of the situation analysis and discussions.

Platform experiences on knowledge translation and collaboration between policy makers and researchers were presented. Thus, the National Evaluation Platform (NEP) in Mali, the platform of Ebony State University, Nigeria and Cochrane centre in Nigeria shared their experiences, challenges and lessons learned.
