BUDGETARY AND FINANCIAL MATTERS

AUDITED ACCOUNTS 1985, BALANCE SHEET AS AT 30 APRIL 1986 AND COMPARISON OF EXPENDITURE INCURRED AS AGAINST BUDGET

- 1. To assist the Commission in its ongoing review of the financial performance of the Commission, the following documents are attached:
 - The Audited Accounts of the Commission for the 1985 financial year as prepared by our auditors, Hunziker Associates, S.A. (ANNEX 1);
 - A Balance Sheet as at 30 April, 1986 (ANNEX 2); and
 - A summary schedule of expenditure and income for the first four months of 1986 and cumulatively for the period from inception of the Commission to the end of April 1986 as compared to the Revised Budget adopted by the Commission at its meeting in Sao Paulo. (ANNEX 3)
- 2. You will note from ANNEX 3 that expenditure during the first four months of this year has been significantly under that budgeted for the same This is due, in part, because we cancelled period. the Commission meeting planned for January but also because we have reduced expenditures wherever possible and delayed payment of invoices whenever appropriate. Cumulative expenditure from inception until the end of April, 1986 has also been slightly under Budget. More importantly, however, you should note that our income for the first four months of 1986 and cumulatively from inception have both been under budget and it is for this reason that we have been facing, and continue to face a serious cash flow problem.

CASHFLOW PROJECTION FOR THE PERIOD 1 MAY, 1986 TO 1 DECEMBER, 1987

3. In view of the Commission's serious funding difficulties, we have prepared and attached as Annex 4 a cashflow projection which sets out (i) the

details of all expenditures incurred to date, (ii) a detailed month-by-month forecast of the minimum expenditures which will need to be made during the period 1 May 1986 to 30 November 1987 if the Commission is to complete its mandate as approved at the Inaugural Meeting (iii) the income we have received from inception to the end of April, 1986 and (iv) the income we can reasonably expect to receive between the 1st of May, 1986 and the end of 1987. In comparing the attached cashflow forecast to the Revised Budget approved in Sao Paulo, you will note that:

- Staff costs have been reduced by \$200,000 due to an advanced reduction of staff (from 11 professionals and 9 support staff at the time of the last Commission Meeting to the present 10 professionals and 8 support staff with further reductions to 8 professionals and 6 support staff by October 1986, to 6 professionals and 4 support staff by January, 1987 and to 4 professionals and 3 support staff by April, 1987).
- The cost of the Commission meeting planned for January/February 1986 has been dropped.
- The cost of programme work has been reduced by \$120,000 due to savings on the costs of commissioned studies, expert meetings and Special Advisors' fees.
- The budget for the Final Report (Popular) has been dropped resulting in a saving of \$100,000.
- On the other hand, because the majority of our expenditures are in Swiss Francs and our income is in US-Dollars and there has been a rapid depreciation of the US-Dollar (from 2.35 Swiss Francs to 1.8 Swiss Francs to the dollar), we have had to include a projected exchange loss of \$335,000 in our cashflow projection. That exchange differential has almost completely offset the savings otherwise effected by our cost cutting measures. Total projected expenditures, therefore, have only decreased from \$7,022,000 to \$6,850,000.
- As regards Income, you will note that as of the end of April, 1986 we had received at total of \$3,834,291 and firm pledges for an additional \$1,295,000 in 1986 and \$250,000 in 1987 for a total of only \$5,379,000. Our funding shortfall is therefore \$1,470,000.

FUNDRAISING EFFORTS AND RESULTS

- 4. Since the Brazil Meeting, and as a result of the developments which the Chairman reported to the Commission in her letter of 5 March, 1986, efforts to secure additional funding for the Commission have intensified. Following the Brazil Meeting, funding proposals were made to numerous U.S. foundations for support and the Chairman called a meeting of donor countries in Geneva in late March at which she presented a proposal to those countries to raise funds from them in an amount, which when added to that obtained from the foundations, would produce sufficient resources to permit the Commission to complete its mandate.
- 5. As a result of these efforts we have to date received pledges of additional support totalling \$850,000, \$250,000 each from Sweden, Norway and the MacArthur Foundation and \$200,000 from the Ford Foundation. Three of the countries at the donors' meeting, Austria, Italy and Switzerland have advised they they cannot at this time commit to make additional contributions; and we are still awaiting responses from the remaining countries at the meeting as well as from the Rockefeller Brothers, the Rockefeller and Alton Jones Foundations and from the Carnegie Corporation.
- 6. Since the Brazil Meeting, we have also received pledges of support from Cameroun (\$15,000), Finland (\$50,000) and Hungary (\$50,000). Attached as ANNEX 5 is a schedule listing contributions pledged and received up to the end of April 1986, those pledged but not yet received and those requested but not received. From that schedule you will note that we have now received contributions of \$3,765,816 and have pledges for an additional \$1,545,000.
- 7. Notwithstanding the success of our recent fundraising efforts, we are far short of the funds still needed (\$1,470,000) to cover our anticipated expenditures. It is therefore important that the Commission have a full discussion in Ottawa on the implications of the crisis we face.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1985 AND
PERIOD FROM MAY 1984 TO DECEMBER 31, 1984

A. Purpose and activity of the commission

The World Commission on Environment and Development is an independent body which has been established to fulfil the following tasks:

- To re-examine the critical issues of environment and development and to formulate innovative, concrete and realistic action-proposals to deal with them;
- 2. To strengthen international co-operation on environment and development and to assess and propose new forms of co-operation that can break out of existing patterns and influence policies and events in the direction of needed change; and
- 3. To raise the level of understanding and commitment to action on the part of individuals, voluntary organizations, businesses, institutes and governments.

The establishment of the Commission has been welcomed by the resolution of the United Nations General Assembly 38/161. The report of the Commission is to be submitted to the General Assembly of 1987.

B. Accounting policies

Revenue and expenditure.

Revenue and expenditure are generally recorded on a cash basis, with the exception of staff repatriation and general costs related to the winding down of the commission and for which a provision has been set up during the current year. Accounting for contributions or services in kind.

Contributions or services in kind received or provided to the Commission are recorded in the accounts at a fair market value, as determined by the donor.

Depreciation of fixed assets.

Fixed assets, including word processing equipment purchased in 1985 at a cost of approximately US\$ 113'000, are fully written-off in the year when acquired.

C. Staff provident fund

Contributions are calculated on the basis of pensionable remuneration of professional staff and gross salaries of general service staff. The Commission and its employees contribute the following percentages of salaries to the provident fund:

Commission 14,5% Employees 7,25%

During 1985 the Commission set aside funds for the purpose of meeting the commitments under the staff provident fund. At December 31, 1985 the assets of the fund were made up as follows:

D. Taxation

The Commission has the status of an international organization and consequently is exempt from any direct taxes.

F. Subsequent event

Subsequent to December 31, 1985, the US Dollar has materially declined against most major currencies, including the Swiss Franc. Whilst the Commission receives most of the contributions in US Dollars, a substantial part of the expenses are being incurred in Swiss Francs.
